

BAPTISM SUNDAY

Do Not Forget and Do Not Forsake the LORD Your God! Hosea 13:1-6, 9

"Moses warned the people of Israel, "Take care, and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life" (Deut. 4:9). This was a warning against the foraetfulness that characterized the children of Israel when they were in the wilderness. They had seen God's great acts of judgment exercised against Egypt. They had experienced God's great deliverance of them through the Red Sea. They had experienced God's provision for them in the manna and the water from the rock. Yet, when they heard the report of the spies concerning the Land of Promise, they forgot all that they had seen, all that they had experienced. God's People have always been Prone to Forget the LORD

OT Kings, Priests and People all "Forgot the LORD their God"

- A. They Forgot their Special Relationship with God (Deut. 7:6)
- B. They Forgot their Obligation to God's Holy Law (Joshua 22:5)
- C. They Forgot God's Powerful Deliverance of Them (Deut. 15:15)

Psalm 103:2-5 Forget not all his benefits!

II. And, Once you Forget the LORD, You Will Easily Forsake the LORD

Forsake: "To abandon, leave, quit, turn away from, neglect, or stray"

- A. Manasseh, Amon and Us: 2 Kings 21:19-22
- B. The LORD: Joshua 1:5, Deuteronomy 31:6

III. But We Must Not Forget, Nor Forsake the LORD:

He is Our **One True Helper**

- A. Our Many False Helps! (Egypt, Assyria, Kings, Princes, Horses)
- B. Our One True Helper: YHWH

Ruminate (Think deeply and often on this): 1 Chronicles 28:9, Isaiah 49:16, John 15:4

Hosea 13:1-6, 9

- 1 When Ephraim spoke, people trembled; he was exalted in Israel. But he became guilty of Baal worship and died.
- 2 Now they sin more and more; they make idols for themselves from their silver, cleverly fashioned images, all of them the work of craftsmen.

It is said of these people, "They offer human sacrifices! They kiss calf-idols!"

- 3 Therefore they will be like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears, like chaff swirling from a threshing floor, like smoke escaping through a window.
- 4 "But I have been the Lord your God ever since you came out of Egypt.

You shall acknowledge no God but me, no Savior except me.

- 5 I cared for you in the wilderness, in the land of burning heat.
- 6 When I fed them, they were satisfied; when they were satisfied, they became proud; then they forgot me.
- 9 "You are destroyed, Israel, because you are against me, against your helper.

Deuteronomy 15:15

Always remember and never forget: You were slaves in the land of Egypt, but the LORD your God delivered you!

2 Kings 21:19-22

Deuteronomy 31:6

6 Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."

1 Chronicles 28:9
